Onsite Wellness Clinic Set To Serve All County Employees

Baldwin County is opening an onsite wellness clinic for county employees at the Baldwin County Government Building. The clinic will open later this month and it will be accessible to all eligible Baldwin County Government employees. The county is providing this benefit at no cost to employees, including no co-pay!

The primary services at the onsite clinic will be to provide medical education and chronic disease management, but also acute/episodic visits too. Some examples are:

- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Diabetes management
- Weight management
- Other chronic health issues
- Other Indocrine illnesses (i.e. hypothyroidism)
- Smoking cessation
- Nutrition and exercise counseling
- Treatment of minor illnesses/sick visits/ acute or episodic care)
- Treatment of minor injuries (excluding all on-the-job injuries)
- Performing blood testing and analysis
- Ability to write prescriptions
- Inventory of onsite medications
- Help to establish a Primary Care Physician
- Make referrals to a Primary Care Physician

It is important to understand that the purpose of this onsite clinic is to NOT interrupt employees' existing relationships with a Primary Care Physician (PCP) they may already have established. The services employees receive from the clinic should complement the care they may receive from their PCP and work in conjunction with them. The onsite clinic can also perform blood testing that a PCP may order, which saves employees a copay and extra time away from work. The onsite clinic's goal is to aid in an employee's care in addition to a physician.

The onsite clinic will be located at 1601 N. Columbia Street, Suite 230. It will be in operation on Mondays and Wednesdays from 8:30am-12:30pm. To schedule an appointment, employees can visit www.timecenter.com/baldwincountyclinic or call Synergy Healthcare at 980-505-8401 (M-Th 8am-5pm, Friday 8am-11:30am EST).

The clinic services will be provided by Synergy Healthcare USA LLC, a clinic management company. Synergy Healthcare partners with municipalities and businesses seeking to provide wellness solutions to their employees by bringing healthcare onsite directly to their place of employment.

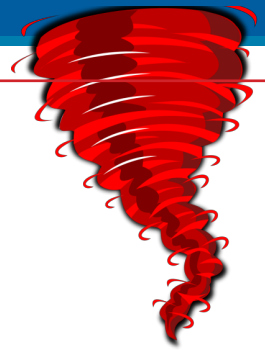
The CodeRED system will be used to send critical and time-sensitive communications such as:

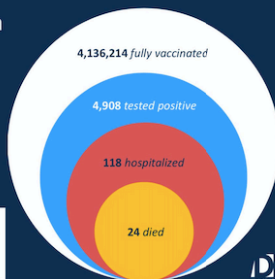
COVID-19 Among Fully Vaccinated In Georgia

COVID-19 Among Fully Vaccinated People in Georgia

From January 19 - July 27, 2021

Of fully vaccinated people:

- 4,908 tested positive (0.12%)
- 118 hospitalized for COVID-19 (0.002853%)
- 24 died due to COVID-19 (0.00058%)



*Breakthrough case definition:
• SARS-CoV-2 RNA (PCR) or antigen detected from a respiratory specimen AND
• Specimen collected ≥ 14 days after completing the primary series of a COVID-19 vaccine (i.e., completed two doses in a two-dose series OR one dose in a one-dose series) AND
• No positive COVID-19 positive laboratory test (RNA (PCR) or antigen positive) within the 90 days prior to the current positive test.

Solid Waste Fee to Increase in September

Effective September 1, 2021 ALL county customers will be charged a monthly Solid Waste Fee. The rate will increase to \$18 per month. You will see new garbage trucks with tracks and covers and longer arms to reduce litter in the county. Additionally, the convenience center hours have been expanded to 9 am to 6 pm each Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday.
