

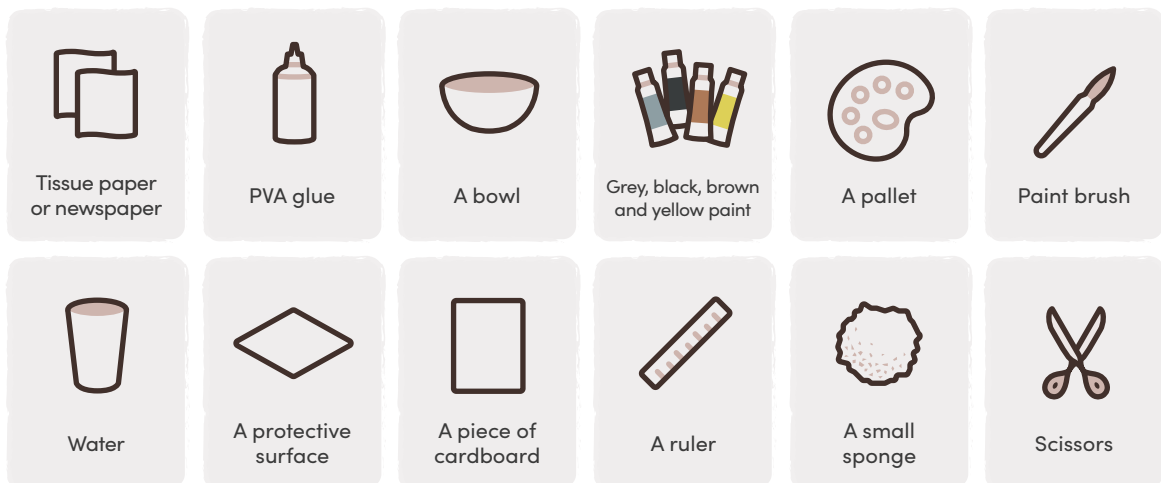

Hogwarts Castle Build

Part 3: Paper Mache and Paint

To paper mache and paint your Hogwarts Castle, you will need:



And for the base of the castle you will need:



These instructions feature the use of sharp tools so adults should always supervise children



Step by Step Instructions - Page 1

1.



Mix 1 part water with 2 parts PVA.
Just like a Potions lesson!

2.



Take strips of newspaper or tissue paper and dip it into the mixture. Place it on the castle over any joins or over tape that can't easily be painted on.

3.



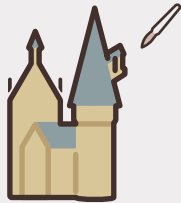
Once dry, paint all the roofs a dark grey colour.
A sponge is useful to get even coverage.

4.



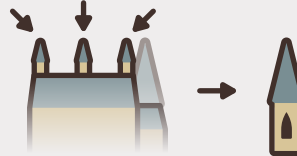
Mix your yellow and brown paints
to create a sandstone colour.

5.



Paint the walls of the castle. Leave to dry.

6.



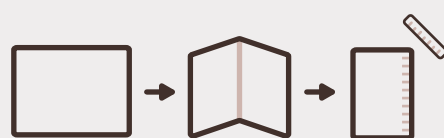
Using your black paint and paintbrush, paint **4** windows on each of the end turrets of the Great Hall...and one on each side of the central turret.

7.



Paint one long and one short window between each of the side turrets on the walls of the hall.
Paint a window on each side of the Entrance Hall.

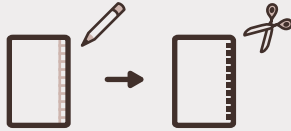
8.



To create your window template, fold a piece of card or thick paper in half. Using your ruler, measure down the folded side to make small marks **1cm** apart.

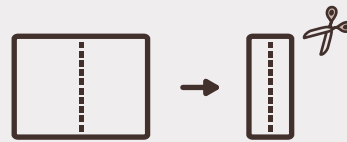

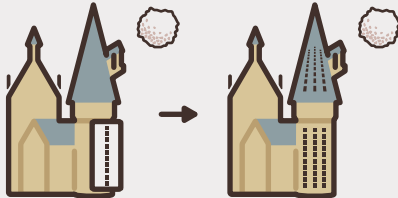
Measure **0.5cm** across from the top and bottom mark and draw a line down the paper to join them. Use your scissors to cut between every other centimetre.

10.



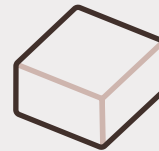
Open the paper to reveal a line of squares. Cut the excess edges off.

11.



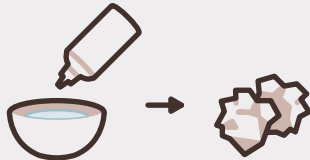
Line your template over the Grand Staircase Tower. Use your black paint and sponge to create the small windows. Leave to dry.

12.



Find a box big enough to act as the castle base. Ours is **40x22x37cm**.

13.



Pour some PVA glue into a bowl. Take pieces of your packing paper and screw them up into balls.

14.



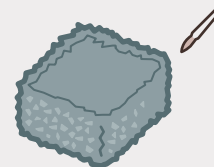
Apply a light layer of glue onto the surface of your base box. Dip one side of the ball into the PVA glue and press against the side of the box to attach to the base.

15.



Continue to do this until your base is covered then leave to dry. It should be firmly in place as though you've used a Permanent Sticking Charm!

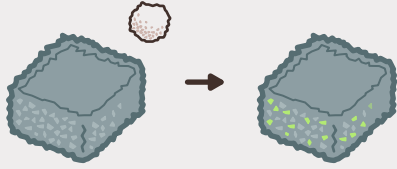
16.



Cover the base with grey paint.

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9.



To add some moss and grass, use your small sponge and green paint to dab some colour around the rocks.

9.
